On 04/07/2018 at approximately 10:22 PM, three UC Merced students were in their apartment when one of them heard a noise of rattling glass on the back patio. The blinds were half open to the patio, giving the suspect the ability to see one of the students in the living room after the suspect jumped the fence to gain access into the rear patio.

When the student looked outside of the sliding glass door, they saw a subject's feet and body jump over the patio wall to escape. The apartment borders the Yosemite Avenue side of the Northwood Village Apartment complex. There is no further description and there were no other similar calls reported to the UC Merced Police Department or the City of Merced Police Department.

Safety Tips:

- If you are home, remember to lock your doors and windows. Do not open your door to anyone you do not know or feel comfortable with.
- If your home or area is not well lit, consider turning on your exterior lights to eliminate shadowed or dark spaces.
- If you are going out alone, make sure that someone knows where you are going, who you will be with and when you expect to return.
- If you start to feel uncomfortable about a person or a situation, trust your feelings and try to remove yourself as quickly as possible from the situation and call law enforcement if necessary.
